



Abandonment - Early Deficits and Limitations

After looking at the many causes of abandonment at different periods of the life cycle, Kathrin Asper focuses at abandonment in the early years of life in the mother child relationship. Deficits and limitations influence this relationship. All this influences the building of the personality and the growth of identity. Furthermore the low self esteem gives raise to different survival strategies and compensations, such as amongst others narcissistic, schizoid, over- adaptive.

The lecture is underscored by case material and paintings done during therapy.



Kathrin Asper, born 1941, is a psycho-therapist and analyst in private practice since 1977, when she graduated from the C.G. Jung Institute in Küsnacht. She is a supervisor, training analyst and lecturer at ISAPZURICH and member of the board. She has studied literature and pedagogy at the University of Zurich where she obtained her Ph.D. in 1966.

As a book author she has published several books, amongst others "The Abandoned Child Within - On Losing and Regaining Self-Worth" (FROMM, New York 1993, new edition in German 2012) and "The Inner Child in Dreams" (Shambhala). Both are available in Danish: Ravnen i glasbjerget

(Gyldendal) and "Barnet i det ubevidste" (Gyldendal). She has lectured and given supervision worldwide.

Boarding School Syndrome:The Psychological Trauma of the 'Privileged' child

In her book published in 2015 Professor Joy Schaverien identified a cluster of symptoms and behaviours, which she proposes be classified as 'Boarding School Syndrome'. In Britain children of affluent families may be sent to boarding school at an early age. Whilst considered to be a privileged form of education, the effect of the sudden and irrevocable, loss of their primary attachments constitutes a significant trauma for many. In some cases bullying and sexual abuse follow, rendering new attachment figures unsafe. To adapt to the system, a defensive and protective encapsulation of the self may be acquired; the true identity of the person then remains hidden. This pattern may continue into adult life, distorting intimate relationships. This has personal and political consequences.



Joy Schaverien PhD is a Training Analyst of the Society of Analytical Psychology in London. She is a Training Analyst and Supervisor for the British Jungian Analytic Association, Visiting Professor for the Northern Programme for Art Psychotherapy and a member of the editorial board of the Journal of Analytical Psychology. She is author of a number of books and articles including: The Revealing Image: Analytical Art Psychotherapy in Theory and Practice, (which was published in 1992 and is still widely read), The Dying Patient in Psychotherapy (published in 2002 a full length case study of the erotic transference and boarding school trauma). Her

most recent book, *Boarding School Syndrome: The Psychological Trauma of the 'Privileged'' Child*, was published in June 2015 and became an Amazon and Routledge best seller.
